



## A SCHOOL SHIP SAILING FOR PEACE IN THE MEDITERRANEAN

MARCH - OCTOBER 2025

Building on the momentum of the *Mediterranean Encounters* in Marseille, the Bel Espoir will set sail on March 1st, 2025 for an eight-month long journey to visit some thirty ports of call around the Mediterranean. Each leg of the trip will host a new group of 25 youths representing diverse nationalities, cultures, and religions.

## MED 25 – Le Bel Espoir: welcome aboard!

*“Become a sea of good, so you may stand against the poverties of our age with solidarity; be a welcoming harbor, to embrace those who seek a better future; be a lighthouse of peace, to destroy, through a culture of human encounter, the dark abyss of violence and war”*

(Pope Francis, Speech at the Pharo, September 22nd 2023)

In response to Pope Francis's call in his closing speech at the Rencontres Méditerranéennes in Marseille, 200 youths representing the diverse nationalities, cultures and religions from the five shores of the Mediterranean (North Africa, the Middle East, the Black Sea and Aegean, the Balkans, Europe) will set sail on board the three-masted ship Le Bel Espoir, from March to October 2025. In groups of twenty-five, they will sail to some thirty ports, take part in peace dialogue training sessions and enjoy a unique maritime and human experience. On returning home, they will make a firm commitment to peace.

Today, political-religious conflicts, economic disparities and climate upheavals threaten to transform countries bordering the Mediterranean into unliveable deserts, scorched by human greed and folly. These situations are pushing thousands of women, men and children onto migration routes, which are often roads of despair, fleeing war and oppression in search of a better life. They are often victims of trafficking, and sometimes drown trying to cross from one shore to the other.

We're not prepared to allow the Mediterranean become a battlefield or a graveyard. We refuse to let political arguments and globalizing concepts take precedence over simple meetings between individuals, each of whom is special and unique. Our fears must not outweigh our hopes. We are convinced that the Mediterranean has also inherited positive, happy memories. Its history of conviviality and exchanges, rich in philosophical and spiritual traditions, holds the key to reconciliation between peoples, cultures and religions. We know that, all around the Mediterranean,

men and women of good will are already carrying out a multitude of initiatives in service of individual dignity and the unity of the human family.

We are committed to caring for our five shores, so that those who live there can look forward to a peaceful future. We choose the culture of face-to-face encounters to guard against the twin deadly dangers of indifference and radicalism. Through these shared moments, through our shared stories, fears can be overcome, bonds reweaved and the will to live in peace rekindled.

This peace will not only come from institutions but will germinate in every inhabitant of our shores as the feeling of belonging to the same human family and awareness that our unity is stronger than our differences grows.

We have a double dream: peace and justice. But it's not just a dream, it's a concrete process, to which more and more youths are committing with energy and talent: after the Mediterranean Meetings in Bari (2020), Florence (2022), Marseille (2023) and Tirana (2024), the MED 25 - Le Bel Espoir maritime expedition will sail with the breath of hope. Welcome aboard!

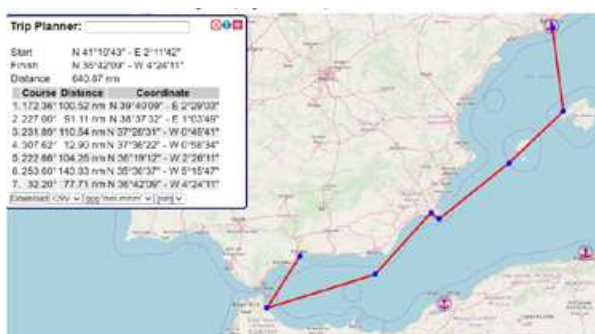

# MED 25 – Le Bel Espoir: partners and crews

The MED 25 - Le Bel Espoir expedition is organized by the Bel Espoir - AJD association, which organizes actions at sea to encourage social mixing and integration of youths; the Mar Yam association, which offers training sessions promoting a culture of dialogue and encounters in the Mediterranean; and the Marseille diocesan association (ADM), which coordinated and hosted the Mediterranean Encounters in September 2023.

### The Mar Yam association

The Mar Yam association organizes “Rencontres Méditerranéennes”, meetings which can be best described as peace as peace training sessions bringing together people from around the Mediterranean.

Supported by a number of networks (faculties, schools, sanctuaries, dioceses, etc.), it helps to develop a culture of encounter and dialogue.

The first meetings were held in Marseille in 2023 and in Tirana in 2024. They will continue on the five shores throughout 2025.

### Association Bel Espoir – AJD

The Bel Espoir - AJD association implements the intuitions of Jesuit Father Michel Jaouen: mixing people, those facing difficult circumstances with others, for the benefit of all.

AJD owns two three-masted schooners, as well as a fleet of small sailing, rowing and motor boats, the Île de Stagadon in the Iroise Sea, a shipyard for training in the sea trades, a base at Aber Wrach (Finistère), a base in Paris and since 2014, in Marseille.

It has around thirty active members, and its shipyard trains around sixty youths a year.

## MED 25 – Le Bel Espoir: a famous three masts

The Bel Espoir II is a 29-meter, three-masted schooner with a 2.80-meter draught. She was built in 1944 in Denmark, to transport livestock between Copenhagen and Hamburg.

Following the Thalassa operation in 1993, an influx of donations enabled her restoration. Nearly put away in 2017, Bel-Espoir was saved by a second restoration. After a major refit, which gave her a new steel hull, while preserving her original rigging, she was able to set sail again in the summer of 2023, and is now preparing to sail the Mediterranean.

# MED 25 – Le Bel Espoir:

## reminders about the Mediterranean process

The MED 25 - Le Bel Espoir expedition is part of the Mediterranean peace process launched in Bari in 2020.

### 1. FRONTIERA DI PACE

*Bari - 2020*

At the initiative of the Italian Bishops' Conference, a process aiming to foster communion between the dioceses bordering the Mediterranean was launched in Bari in 2020. This process is in keeping with the spirit of the Mediterranean journeys of Pope Francis who, since his first trip to the island of Lampedusa (2013) and then to Tirana, Sarajevo, Lesbos, Cairo, Jerusalem, Cyprus, Rabat, Naples, Malta, etc., has been committed to making this sea a message of hope for all.

### 2. FRONTIERA DI PACE 2

*Florence - 2022*

After Bari, a meeting was held in Florence in 2022, bringing together bishops and mayors from across the Mediterranean, in tribute to Giorgio La Pira, a former mayor of Florence who was deeply committed to peace and dialogue. On this occasion, a "Mediterranean Youth Council" was launched. To date, 50 youths sent by 25 Mediterranean bishops' conferences are working on various peace-building projects in the Mediterranean.

### 3. MEDITERRANEAN MEETINGS

*Marseille - 2023*

The Rencontres Méditerranéennes took place in Marseille in September 2023, with an assembly of 70 youths and 70 bishops at its center. Many other events took place throughout the city to celebrate: a major festival with theatrical programming, cultural visits, inter-religious meetings, a solidarity banquet, an NGO forum, and more. Pope Francis closed the festival at the Pharo after paying tribute to migrants who died at sea at Notre-Dame de la Garde. He also visited the Saint-Mauront district to meet people in precarious situations, and celebrated mass at the Velodrome stadium in the presence of 57,000 people.

### 4. MED 24 MIGRATIONS

*Marseille - April 2024*

In early April 2024, some 50 people from all over the Mediterranean region, as well as from Afghanistan, Cameroon and Burkina Faso, gathered in Marseille to discuss migration issues. Six Mediterranean countries (Morocco, Spain, Albania, Greece, Israel, Italy) and six French dioceses (Marseille, Montpellier, Aix en Provence, Nice, Gap-Embrun, Nantes), as well as some twenty associations, were represented. Conferences, workshops in small groups, a round-table discussion on "The issues and challenges of pastoral commitments in the service of migrants" and an NGO festival took place in a fraternal and festive atmosphere.

### 5. SCHOOL OF PEACE

*Tirana - September 2024*

From September 15 to 21, Tirana, Albania, played host to the 2024 edition of the "School of Peace" training session initiated at the 2023 Mediterranean Encounters. 50 youths took part. Christian, Jewish, Muslim, Druze, or agnostics, they were selected for their community involvement and their concrete commitment to peace in the Mediterranean. They were joined by 14 bishops, with whom they discussed the challenges of religious pluralism in the fields of education, environmental safeguarding and communication. These "School of Peace" sessions complement the initiatives taken by the Youth Council run by the Italian Bishops' Conference.

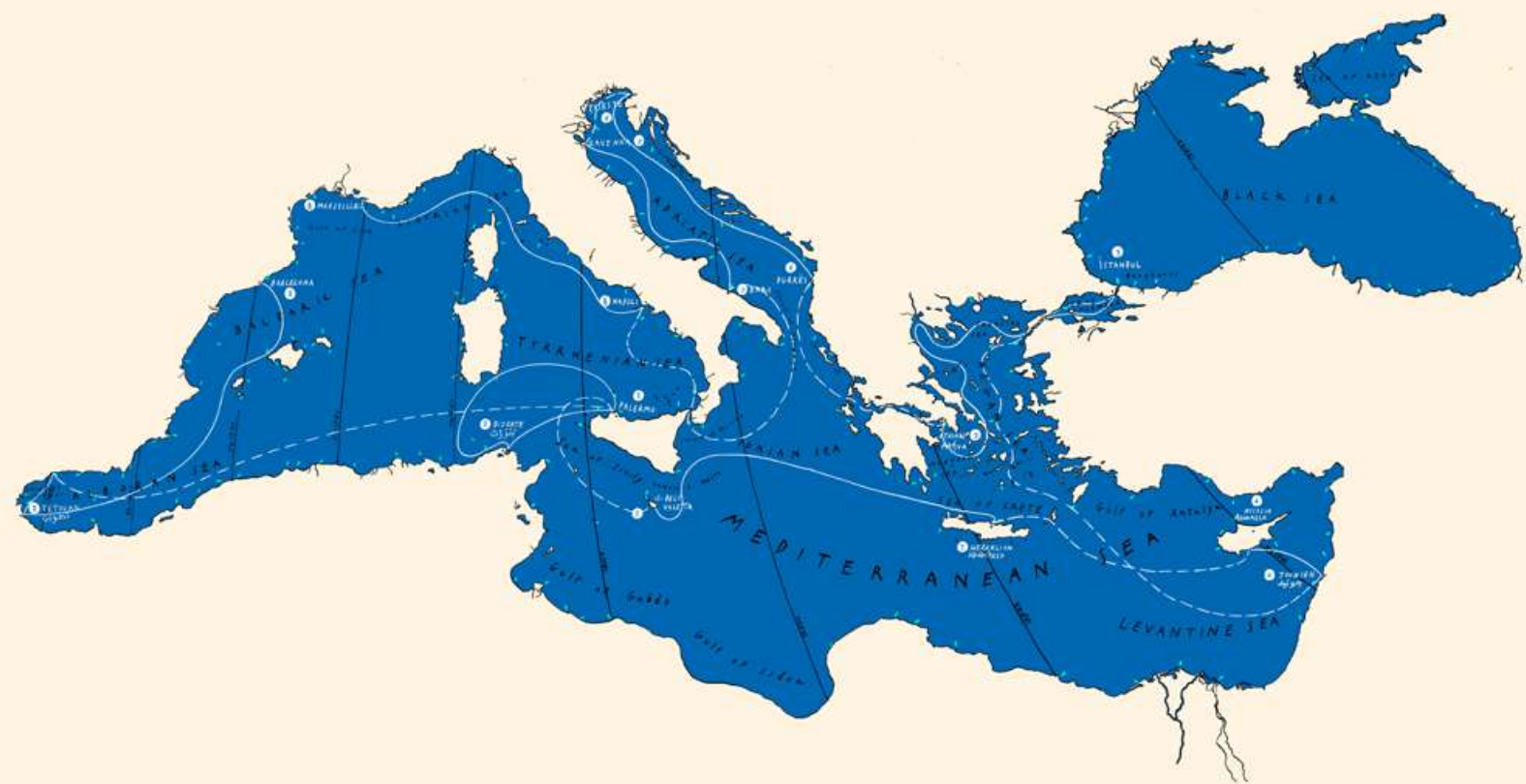
